## IT'S NOT OVER . . .

It is anticipated that the 2003 Regular Session will end this evening without the Legislature having completed its one constitutionally mandated task – passing next year's budget. Consequently, a special session will be called to deal with the budget and other huge issues such as medical malpractice that got bogged down as a result of budget wrangling.

History tells us one thing about special sessions: if the outcomes are not pretty well greased before they are called, they usually implode. Governor Bush, Senate President Jim King, and House Speaker Johnny Byrd are now meeting to decide when to call the special session, with the Governor and Speaker hoping to call it sooner than later, so anticipated pressure from voters in the districts will not weaken their "no new taxes" position. If history provides any insights, setting a special session at this point, without there being any substantive resolution to the major issues at bar, is a formula for failure. Hopefully, regardless of the benefits or detriment to either the House or Senate special session strategies, they will call the session at an appropriate time, after big picture issues only the leadership can handle are addressed.
